New K-6 Science and Technology syllabus



The new Science and Technology K-6 syllabus was released by NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) in 2017 and implementation begins in 2019.

The new syllabus builds on the strengths of the existing NSW Science and Technology K–6 syllabus (2012). The new syllabus identifies the knowledge, understanding, skills, values and attitudes that students are expected to develop in Science and Technology. Science and Technology is one of the six key learning areas in the primary curriculum and consists of five strands.

- In **Living World** students learn about living things, the needs of living things and where food comes from.
- In **Material World** students explore the characteristics and properties of materials and substances.
- In Physical World students explore forces, energy and how the physical characteristics of objects affect movement.
- In **Earth and Space** they learn about the Earth's place in the universe and about caring for the Earth's resources.

In Digital Technologies they investigate existing technologies and create digital solutions.

Students will develop an understanding of the five strands through two skill processes: Working Scientifically, and Design and Production. This enables students to answer questions and develop creative solutions to problems.
