



The National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence is an initiative that aims to create positive action to prevent bullying with students, school staff and our school communities.

The 2023 theme, 'Growing Connections', promotes the importance of student connectedness and sense of belonging, helping students feel accepted, respected, included and supported.





What is bullying?

- Bullying is purposely hurting someone else.
- Bullying is REPETITIVE which means it happens again and again. It is not the same as something happening once.
- Bullying can be physical, verbal or mental. It hurts the victim a lot and in many different ways. Bullying includes racial comments.

Respect and acceptance are values we consistently focus on and include as one of our Positive Behaviour for Learning expectations – BE RESPECTFUL.

On this special day, Harcourt students participated in discussions and activities to create awareness and utilise supportive tools as they interact with one another.

We encourage all family members to talk about what their child has learned, look at the difference between bullying and isolated incidences and support their child as they practice respectful and responsible interactions with others.

They also got to visit classrooms and experience some of the learning activities that students participate in on a daily basis to build their knowledge and skills. School student travel information for parents and students

School Travel Passes

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to apply or update their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their local bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

New Student Opal cards (including new Term Bus Passes) will be sent to the student's nominated postal address within two weeks of their application being approved.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.





All proceeds from the Father's Day sale will support Harcourt students in their learning journey.








Traditionally, the P & C have provided plastic bags for the students to carry their purchases.
