
















Angelo in 5/6L suggests we should read a joke book to enjoy a laugh.

Nicole in 5/6N explored how friction can work together with the rice and the pencil to enable her to lift a bottle by just holding the pencil.




In Creative Arts, students have learnt how to use shading to create a 3D effect to their sketches.


In PDHPE, students have explored the food groups and various ways to make their meals healthier.

Did you know that screen breaks are essential?

Regular breaks help you to reduce your stress and they also help your eyes to focus on something else at different distances away from you. A screen break also makes you move your body so that your blood flow increases, you oxygenate your brain, and your muscles move and flex.

Recent research has shown that our brains aren't idle when we take breaks. Instead, they are hard at work processing memories and helping us make sense of what we experience. Thus, screen breaks are crucial for consolidating memories, reflecting on past experiences, and planning for the future—in other words, it helps shape how we make sense of our lives.

Overall, screen breaks keep our brains healthy and play a key role in cognitive (brain) abilities such as comprehension (understanding something) and thinking up new ideas or things to try.

It's true! Just ask our Year 5 and Year 6 students. Watch two videos below that will inspire you to take a well deserved break from your device.


