


ICT in Stage 2

3H has been searching for 3D objects and taking photos to upload it to share with their peers on Google Classroom. It is incredible how many different 3D objects we have around us when we look more closely!






















English as an Additional Language or

Dialect

Kindergarten

Kindergarten students have been reading and reciting nursery rhymes, finger plays and number rhymes to improve their vocabulary, literacy and phonemic awareness .They are identifying rhyming words in texts and listening to a rhyme and providing the missing word. These rhymes are also being linked to writing and craft activities.





Stage 1

Stage one students have been using the Immersive Reader program to write, record and listen to their work. This program also allows New Arrival students to translate their speaking, reading and writing into their first language. This is of great benefit as it allows students to make connections between English and their first language.

Stage 2

As part of their Reading and Writing units this term, Stage 2 have been learning about informative texts. Students are learning the use of technical vocabulary and how to organise and sequence information.







Stage 3













