### **Principal's News**

As mentioned in the previous newsletter, many projects were underway. It is pleasing to share that the COLA project has now finished, and we have begun teaching the students to be Harcourt Heroes by playing safely on the equipment. The work completed included improved drainage systems under the COLA, new guttering, bird netting to reduce the pigeons nesting near the play area, the replacement of the play equipment and soft fall, as well as the installation of fencing to ensure safe and supervised use of the area.



The cooler classrooms project has also begun. Cooling/heating units are being fitted to 20 learning spaces across the school. Students are being relocated to spare classrooms as work occurs in their room to reduce any disruption to learning. This is a large project and will take place right through to the end of the school year.

New games and colourful activity templates have been installed on the pavement areas. It is enjoyable to spend time with the students as they play on these. Over the holidays we are having lines outlining safe play areas installed and the full green circle replaced in the courtyard. Kindergarten Green can't wait!

Enjoy the holiday break, stay safe and we look forward to spending the last term of the year continuing to achieve and grow with you.




## Stage 1 – Years 1 & 2




## ) Take a Peek into Stage One


Our Stage One students are impressing their teachers every day with their learning growth.

Students have been developing their number knowledge by exploring place value to understand two and three-digit numbers. They have been learning about fractions to share objects and collections into equal parts. Students have been learning how to tell the time, learn the months and seasons of the year. They are exploring 3D objects and much much more.









Active learners are everywhere in Stage One.

Students are using their writing skills to plan and write their own fairy tales or fractured fairy tales. They are also performing readers theatre which includes using the green screen to add special effects to their performances.





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### Stage 2 – Years 3 & 4

## Learning in Stage 2

Stage Two have had a busy time learning different ways to demonstrate their understanding of what they have learnt in class this term. With technology, students have been to producing iMovies for Drama to show case their talents. They have also been working on comprehending mathematical concepts through Chance games, angles in art and co-constructing success criteria in probability.



4H are collaboratively writing a script using Google Docs. We are going to use iMovie on the iPads to turn the script into a movie.



3S are completing a Maths lesson on chance using Heads & Tails coin game.



4H students are participating in a table read of their script to practice how they are going to perform their lines in front of a camera.

3H are conducting a chance experiment in maths, using die. We also made spinners to predict what the outcome would be.



3S experimented in Art with an Angle recognition idea.




3/4N are exploring filming and camera angles using iMovie. We are becoming future movie stars and producers!



### Stage 3 - Years 5 & 6




### All Stage Three classes have been working on explaining their learning to their peers.



They use ICT, such as Flipgrid and video editor, to share their knowledge.






Students have been developing their vocabulary and strategies to help their explanations.




Stage One students are learning about "Transports" in Term 3. Students are given the opportunity to use their Chinese language to speak about their favourite transport in class.

*"I like how you finished your food before you played"* 




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## **Congratulations!**
